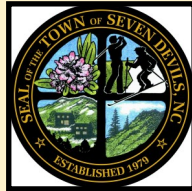
Our Public Works Department is working hard to clean up the streets that have been constantly treated this winter; see the article regarding the scheduled debris pickups.

Old Town Hall Update—Open for Business!

The newly renovated Old Town Hall is ready and open for use!

This facility can be accessed ONLY by assigned key fobs to property owners. This means that you MUST HAVE a key fob to use the Exercise Room & Book Exchange, effective April 1st.

Starting Monday, April 5th, property owners can register for key fobs at New Town Hall, Mondays - Fridays 8:30am-5:00pm.

Each household will receive 1 key fob at no charge. A second key fob will cost \$20 (we accept cash or check ONLY for additional fobs). For quicker registration, please print and complete the Community Center Agreement before arriving at New Town Hall. The Community Center Agreement can be found on the Town's website at sevendevils.net/OTH-Agreement

From the Town Clerk:

There's been no time for napping here at Town Hall, and the calendar is filling with Board & Committee meetings in upcoming months. It's such a privilege to witness government at it's best with the dedication of citizens that serve the Town in various roles.

In February, the Planning Board met to review the state required transition of the UDO from Chapter 160A to 160D. Most of the changes were minor technical edits. The Planning Board also reviewed & forwarded their recommendations to the Town Council to adopt 2 new Nuisance Ordinances. Effective February 9th, Recreational Vehicles are prohibited in the Town limits, with limited exceptions. Also approved was a Nuisance Ordinance now requiring vehicles to be equipped with chains, snow tires or 4WD/AWD during winter conditions, when the flashing sign is on. The violation is \$150.00. All the Town's Nuisance Ordinances are posted to the website.

At the Town Council meeting on April 13th, there will be a presentation by the NC Wildlife Commission about the deer population in the region. It's a concern for many citizens, and this is a chance to learn more. This is the season the wildlife comes to life, from tiny creatures to hungry bears! Remember, the Town requires owners to have adequate trash receptacles to prevent littering by critters, weather or people. Short term rentals should pay extra attention and let their guests be aware of proper disposal, as \$100 fines are charged to the homeowner for violations.

And one last word from our Fire Chief, as the mountain fills with seasonal visitors, follow the rules for safe & fun firepit enjoyment. Use a screen, keep a water hose close, and fully extinguish any embers when done. And don't forget, do not burn debris in firepits! All outdoor burning of debris requires a burn permit issued by the Fire Department.

Town Wide Debris Pick Up Dates:

Deadline	Pick up begins on/after
April 25th	April 26th
June 20th	June 21st
Sept 30th	Oct 1st

- Limbs must be less than 3" in diameter
- Place limbs along Town Road right of way
- Limbs must be personally cut, will not pick up trimmings from tree/landscape companies
- Public Works will chip the limbs—Do not include vegetation, weeds or leaves
- Public Works has final decision of debris pick up or owner's responsibility
