TOWN OF SEVEN DEVILS TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES – REGULAR MEETING

July 9, 2013

The Seven Devils Town Council met in regular session on Tuesday, July 9, 2013, at Town Hall. Present were Mayor Larry Fontaine, Council Members Kay Ehlinger, David Ehmig, and David Hooper. Mayor Pro Tem Brad Lambert and Town Attorney Rob Angle were absent. Also present was Town Manager Ed Evans. The minutes were recorded by Sara Miller, Town Clerk.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Fontaine called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Council members and citizens recited the Pledge of Allegiance

ADOPT AGENDA

Member Ehlinger made a motion to adopt the agenda. Member Hooper seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA - MOTION FOR CONSIDERATION

Mayor Fontaine stated his desire that the name of the new Recreation Commission member, Dr. Michael Potter, to be added to the June 11, 2013 Regular Town Council Minutes. Manager Evans stated that the proper procedure would be to move these minutes from the Consent Agenda and considered separately. Mayor Fontaine stated that this item would become item D in Old Business. Member Hooper made a motion to move the Regular Town Council Minutes to Old Business item D. Member Ehlinger seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously.

Member Ehlinger made a motion to approve the remaining items on the Consent agenda. Member Ehmig seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING—COMMUNICATION TOWER ORDINANCE

Member Hooper made a motion to open the Public Hearing regarding the Communication Tower Ordinance. Member Ehmig seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously.

Mayor Fontaine opened the floor for citizen comments regarding the proposed Ordinance. No comments were made.

Mayor Fontaine made a motion to close the Public Hearing regarding the Communication Tower Ordinance. Member Ehlinger seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Bob Bridges, 147 Deepwood Court, expressed concern over the condition of the drainage grate at the base of Seven Devils Road, at the edge of Hwy 105. He stated that it is in great disrepair and is concerned that it will end up damaging his or another residents tire. Manager Evans stated that he had called in the past about repair to that area, and a temporary repair was made, but he will call and check again about getting a more permanent repair done.

Anne Fontaine, 127 West Rocky Top, stated that the total miles walked so far had reached 2169.06 miles. She also reminded everyone that the Salamander workshop will be held at Town Hall on July 12 starting at 10:30AM.

Gary Rose, 268 Lillian Drive, stated that he had several concerns to express to the Council regarding the pending purchase of Otter Falls. He and his family have owned property in Seven Devils for 6 years. His concerns were two fold; the first of which was the private road being used by citizens excessively; second, unauthorized use of the green space, which is part of their HOA, and a liability issue.

Mayor Fontaine stated that the Town dropped the ball regarding notification in our advertising that the Otter Falls property is 'private' as is the access. He stated that the presentation for SafetyFest (board in meeting room) with the pictures should have noted this. He stated that the Town did not adequately inform people and he apologized and that if this had been done, it would have mitigated some of the intrusion over that weekend. "The enthusiasm was great for this possible acquisition and that overcame their sensibilities that weekend," he stated. "They walked right by the no trespassing signs. Their enthusiasm was based on giving money, and they wanted to see more than pictures to base their investment on." The Mayor said, "The Town is going to get more signs to be put up even before the sale goes through. Once the sale goes through, the Town will provide access that would not utilize Lillian Dr., and signs would state that it is not an official entrance. The Town would provide an entrance on Skyland on the other side of the property, a trail, trailhead, and pull out. The Town would placard Lillian Dr. as private property and that access to Otter Falls was not permitted through Lillian Dr. and Blair Mountain Estates." Mayor Fontaine apologized again, and said he was shocked when he heard who went down during SafetyFest weekend. He understood their feelings about liability and the road was already in rough shape with washouts. Mayor Fontaine stated that he had "talked to Officer Jimmy Keener, and the policemen were aware of the situation. The Seven Devils community association gave \$5,000.00 to help with the acquisition. If the Town acquires the property it would improve everyone's property value. But that the Town would not want to impose and negatively affect Blair Mountain Estates property values because of the access, etc."

Mr. Rose stated that was one of their concerns, the private roads having a lot of use. The HOA may put a gate up on the private road and more signs. It was a beautiful place, and they love it. The community was more concerned about the liability and road.

Mayor Fontaine stated that he had "walked down a month ago, and parked in the circle in Blair Mountain Estates. The area was beautiful and Otter Falls would hopefully be owned by the Town. The Town would only allow limited access and was not interested in a road down or a camp ground. The intent was to try to keep it as pristine as possible. If people brought things in, they bring them out. The area would need to be policed. There would be times when Public Works may need access through Lillian Dr., and would call regarding obtaining access. The Town hoped to easily cooperate with the Blair Mountain Estates community and the public would not be traipsing through their private property."

Mr. Rose asked if the goal was not to put facilities down there, and just to construct a walking trail. Mayor Fontaine stated, "The Town's only intention was to construct a trail, with no campground or large scale facilities."

Lisa Otter Rose stated that her concern was regarding how the police would be able to monitor what happens at the falls. She had gone down to the falls and had seen college students there illegally. Past where the trail turns, the visibility is very limited to see who and what would be at the falls, unless you hike in.

Mayor Fontaine stated that a gate could help at the beginning of the access road. He also stated that he "believes the people Mrs. Rose referred to would have no issues parking anywhere and walking down. The Town's parking area would be a dawn to dusk parking area, so if cars were present after those hours, they would be ticketed." Mayor Fontaine said that expecting the police officers to hike down to the falls was a little unreasonable, but the Town would have no problem with the Public Works employees making a tour of the place and keeping it up as a public facility. The Town did not intend to put trash barrels down at the falls.

After more discussion, Manager Evans stated that he told Lisa Rose that he would put up signage, but did not get to it today, and would complete the task tomorrow. He intended to put up *private property* and *no trespassing* signs to help deter people from coming in for now. The Town would try its best to eliminate as much traffic as possible.

Mrs. Rose stated that someone had parked in the middle of the road in Blair Mountain Estates and she and her party proceeded to go to the falls. She tripped and fell in the green space, but she was not hurt. If she had hurt herself it would have been the HOA's responsibility and liability to take care of. She then asked if they could put up no parking signs. Manager Evans stated that the Town saw no issue with signage to prevent parking near the green space.

Mayor Fontaine concluded with saying that Otter Falls had always been accessed that way, so it would be a learning curve for people to relearn not to go that way. He asked for those concerned in Blair Mountain Estates to please be as patient as possible as the Town worked to alleviate the issues.

<u>ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE & CALENDAR</u>—Town Manager Evans stated that the ABC Board will meet on Thursday, July 11, 2013 at 4:00PM. Manager Evans also stated that the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) from DENR is available on the Town's website and at Town Hall, and that residents were informed via the July water bill and the summer Echo edition that it would not be mailed.

OLD BUSINESS

COMMUNICATION TOWER ORDINANCE—After a brief discussion, Member Ehmig made a motion to adopt the Communication Tower Ordinance. Member Hooper seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously.

Member Hooper then made a motion to rescind the Communication Tower Moratorium. Member Ehmig seconded the motion. The members agreed unanimously. **~CLOSED~**


